

CODE OF CONDUCT

Asheville Empire Lacrosse (Empire) abides by a strict Code of Conduct. Players, coaches, spectators and parents are to conduct themselves in a manner that demonstrates respect to other players, coaches, officials, parents and spectators. In becoming a member of the Empire community an individual assumes certain obligations and responsibilities to the game of lacrosse, to the Empire and its participants.

The essential elements in this "Code of Conduct" are HONESTY and INTEGRITY. Those who conduct themselves in a manner that reflects these elements will bring credit to the sport of lacrosse, themselves, their team and their organization. It is only through such conduct that our sport can earn and maintain a positive image and make its full contribution to youth sports in the United States and around the world. US Lacrosse and the Empire believe that it should be a priority of every lacrosse player, team and program (including parents, guardians and its leaders) to HONOR THE GAME in every sense of these words. The following essential elements of the CODE OF CONDUCT are expected from players, parents, guardians, coaches, leadership and officials:

- Sportsmanship and teaching the concepts of fair play are essential to the game and must be taught at all levels and developed both at home and on the field during practices and games. The value of good sportsmanship, the concepts of fair play, and the skills of the game should always be placed above winning.
- The safety and welfare of the players are of primary importance.
- Players should always demonstrate positive behavior and respect toward teammates, opponents, coaches, officials, parents and spectators. Coaches are expected to educate their players as to the important role of lacrosse officials and reinforce the ideal of respect for the official to players/teammates.
- Officials are professionals and are therefore expected to conduct themselves as such and in a manner that demonstrates total
 impartiality, courtesy and fairness to all parties. Complaints pertaining to official's behavior must directed to tournament
 organizers by coaching staff or Empire leadership only.
- Coaches must always be aware of the tremendous influence they have on their players. They are to strive to be positive role
 models in dealing with young people, as well as adults.
- Coaches, players, parents and spectators are expected to demonstrate the utmost respect for officials, coaches, and fellow parents/spectators.
- Spectators involved with the game must never permit anyone to openly or maliciously criticize, badger, harass or threaten an official, coach, player, opponents or any other parties involved with the sport.
- By becoming a member of the Empire travel program, parents/guardians agreed to respect and adhere to the policies and decisions made by Empire leadership and coaching staff at ALL times.
- Any grievances regarding club or team decisions or policies made by coaches, leadership, officials or any other parties involved
 with the sport should be communicated through the proper channels and procedures. At no time should discussions take place
 on or about the field of play in view or earshot of spectators, participants/players or officials. Adherence to the 24-Hour rule is
 critical.

The Empire Board has adopted a ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY in connection with any inappropriate or aggressive adult behavior. These actions include but are not limited to the following: i) approaching a coach or official during a game; ii) confronting a coach on the field or bench during a game or practice; iii) disrespecting the confidentiality of all players and decisions made by coaches or Empire leadership; iv) ANY violation of the Empire 24-Hour Communication Rule.

Neither parents nor players are to ask coaches about 'position' changes or playing time during games. Parents, if you feel your child is not being given opportunities appropriate to their ability, defer to the 24-Hour Communication Policy and address your issues or any league concerns at an appropriate time with the appropriate personnel.

Please do not address these concerns during a game, practice or in front of players, parents, opponents, officials or spectators. The Empire Board may take immediate action on any violation and reserves the right to ban parents, guests, or any person from the tournament venue or practice fields. The Empire Board may also permanently release/remove the parents and their player(s) from the league with no refund.



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All members of the Empire community agree to abide by the Code of Conduct and to be subjected to the consequences of violating the Code. It is understood that players, parents and coaches are all bound by this Code of Conduct and its validity is hereby a matter of record and is not dependent upon physical signature.

In summary, players, parents/guardians and coaches must agree to read and fully understand the following Empire expectations:

Players -

- Exhibit good sportsmanship and fair play on and off the field during practices and games.
- Give 100% effort at each practice and every game.
- Do not use foul language (cursing/swearing) when involved with any and all Asheville Empire Lacrosse activity nor should you
 direct derogatory comments toward teammates, coaches, officials, opposing players, parents or spectators.
- Respect, listen and learn from coaching staff and privately address them with any issues or concerns.
- Support and encourage ALL my teammates and set a positive example. Acknowledge that the safety and welfare of the players
 are of primary importance.
- Study, learn and understand ALL the rules of the game of lacrosse and abide by them.
- Commit to learning and understanding any and all plays given by coaching staff.
- Understand that officials have a job to do and players will not criticize, badger, harass, or threaten a game official.
- Do not attempt to manipulate the rules to take unfair advantage of an opponent, nor will I engage deliberately in unsportsmanlike conduct.
- Players found using or possessing a controlled or illegal substance (including alcohol and vaping), will be subjected to appropriate and immediate consequences.
- Demonstrate responsibility by taking good care of gear/equipment and uniforms. This also includes bringing and/or wearing the required equipment and proper uniform at all games and practices.
- Be modest in victory and gracious in defeat.

Parents -

- The emphasis on winning should never be placed above the value of good sportsmanship, the concepts of fair play, or the skills
 of the game.
- Respect the decisions made by leadership and coaching staff. Respect the game of lacrosse and its roots.
- Do not coach your child at practices or games (unless, of course, you are their coach). Let players play and coaches coach, and support both in a positive manner.
- Derogatory comments are unacceptable. Use positive reinforcement with players and adults alike. Do not EVER criticize Empire
 players, opposing team members, officials, fellow parents, spectators or anyone on the fields regardless of the circumstance. It
 should be remembered that criticism, once made, can never be retracted.
- Understand and adhere to our "24-Hour Communication Rule": Simply put, parents/guardians, players, coaches and leadership
 will not discuss ANY club decisions and/or policies, team make-up, results of a game, practice or situation until at least 24-hours
 after the fact.
- A full description of our 24-Hour Communication Rule is available on our website at www.ashevilleempire.com. This important rule does two things
 - First, it moves the discussion away from the presence of the players and/or adults not involved in the situation or circumstance.
 - Second, it allows all parties to have time to put things in perspective and "cool off", if necessary



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Coaches -

- The safety and welfare of the players are of primary importance. Teach the rules of lacrosse and abide by them ALWAYS.
- Coaches must always be aware of the tremendous influence they have on their players and must reinforce the self-image of
 each player. Be positive role models and provide a constructive environment in dealing with their players, their parents and
 fellow coaches on and off the field.
- The emphasis on winning should never be placed above the value of good sportsmanship, the concepts of fair play, or the skills
 of the game. Respect the game of lacrosse and its roots.
- Derogatory or inflammatory comments are unacceptable. Use positive reinforcement with players and adults alike. Do not EVER
 criticize Empire players, opposing team members or coaches, officials or spectators regardless of the circumstance. It should be
 remembered that criticism, once made, can never be retracted.
- Practice transparent communication with players, parents and Empire leadership. Coaches are expected to be receptive to all
 player communications and engage players (and their parents) proactively regarding issues involving practice or game
 performance, behavioral concerns or attendance issues.
- Establish objectives for the team and individual players and inform each player of team and individual goals.
- Be modest in victory and gracious in defeat.

All Empire -

- Knowledge of the Rules of Lacrosse must be respected and adhered to by all who participate in the game of lacrosse, both in the letter and the spirit of the game.
- Any conduct, including abusive language. malicious behavior, indecent gestures, racially insensitive remarks, derogatory
 comments of team/club decisions or policies, inflammatory or hostile communication, damage to property or belongings, or any
 other conduct that reflects poorly on a parent, guardian, player or member of the Empire family or Asheville Empire Lacrosse as
 a club is deemed to be unacceptable and will not be tolerated. This rule applies to all players, parents, siblings, guests, coaches
 and officials AT ALL TIMES.
- During all tournaments, AWAY play days, scrimmages or games, you are representing the Empire. Any conduct unbecoming will
 not be tolerated (on or around fields and surrounding areas).

CONSEQUENCES -

The following sets forth the discipline guidelines for responding to league participant Code of Conduct violations; HOWEVER, the Empire Board reserves the right to vary its response from these guidelines based on the severity of the violation of Code. No refunds will be granted to those players dismissed from the club for violating the Code of Conduct.
